

In recent email interviews regarding the ongoing Septa funding crisis, representatives from both TFP and TRU voiced deep concerns about the uncertainty surrounding public transportation's future. They emphasized the potentially severe impact of funding gaps on daily commuters and the wider Philadelphia community, noting that service cutbacks or fare hikes could disproportionately affect low-income riders who rely on Septa the most. Both groups called for urgent action from state and local leaders to secure sustainable funding, warning that delayed solutions could lead to lasting damage to the region's mobility, economic stability, and overall quality of life.
